



Colombia's Safety & Security

4.6% annual average decrease in homicide rates

Colombian cities are not registered among the most dangerous of the world. (In 2021, 26.8 intentional homicides were registered every 100.000 inhabitants).

Security increase in more than 80% in the last 10 years

Acts of terrorism and kidnapping have significantly reduced in the past decade.

Colombia is one of the first countries in the world to enact a specific law on cyberspace regarding access to personal information, data interception and the use of malicious software.




Colombia Ranks 3rd in Latin America in A.T. Kearney's Global Services Location Indicator

Amazon in 2019 opened its first shared services center in Colombia with approximately 600 employees. The center is focused on serving customers in Spanish, English and Portuguese.




















Colombia recently ranked #1 in the Offshore BPO Confidence Index

About the study

- 100 BPO providers surveyed with locations in 17 countries
- On a scale of one to five, BPOs were asked to rate their confidence in the many considerations of doing business in their country
- 7 categories: Local Labor Market (#1), Infrastructure (#2), Commercial Property (#3), BPO Ecosystem (#1), Political Stability (#3), Public Security (#5), Economic Stability (#5)

"Among the study's principal findings is the emergence of stability as a critical differentiator. It has become more important than ever for BPOs to operate in a location unencumbered by political, economic, or public security disruptions. Equally, the availability of talent at a time when BPO-oriented labor is tighter than ever is a crucial determinant in the success of different offshore and nearshore locations










BPO ecosystem in Colombia














Graduates in systems engineering, telematics and related areas








Colombia has a free trade zone regime with one of the most attractive incentive packages in the region.

Free trade zones are available throughout the country, especially near the country's main seaports and airports.

O2. No customs duties (VAT and tariffs) are levied or paid on goods introduced into the Free Trade Zone.

O3. Goods of foreign origin introduced into the free zone may remain there indefinitely.

Q4. Possibility of exporting from the Free Trade Zone to third countries.

VAT exemption for raw materials, parts, inputs and finished goods sold from the national customs territory to Free Trade Zone users or between them.







The Colombian government seeks to strengthen the Services sector through the implementation of new incentives & programs

Law 2010 of 2019 - Article 108-5

With the inclusion of this new article, the following is sought:

Establish a deduction in the determination of income of 120% of salary payments (up to 115 UVT per worker) with respect to workers under 28 years of age linked to the labor market for the first time, after certification issued by the Ministry of Labor, this deduction will proceed during the taxable year in which the worker is hired.

LAW 2069 of 2020 - Remote Work

Considering the new world circumstances, enable work beyond telework, in order to guarantee the generation of employment in the country, and the consolidation and growth of companies. The national government will regulate the matter. It has not yet been regulated.

(Migratory) The National Government will issue a special regime for the entry, permanence and work in the country of the so-called "digital nomads". Which include people dedicated to remote and / or independent work, including the modalities of telework, remote work and / or remote work. It is not yet regulated by the National Government.

ICT Mission 2022 - 100 thousand developers

The Program seeks that by 2022, 100,000 Colombians have been trained in programming and software development, mainly in: AI, IoT, Cloud Services, Robotics and Management of relational databases.

Additionally, they will acquire knowledge in English and develop skills such as teamwork, perseverance and professional ethics.

Bilingualism Program - SENA

The SENA Language Program is the Entity's response to the requirements of the productive sector regarding the training of its future workers in a foreign language or second language.

With this it is sought that workers have a better job performance, increasing the competitiveness and quality of service of their companies compared to their peers worldwide, especially in languages such as English, French and Portuguese.

VAT exemption on the export of services

VAT exemption with bimonthly refund for services that are provided from Colombia and are used or consumed exclusively abroad by companies or individuals without business or activities in Colombia.

Also applicable to services related to the production of films, television, audiovisual content and software development; protected by copyright, which once exported are disseminated from abroad in the international market and can be accessed from Colombia by electronic means

Requirements

- Be registered as an exporter of services in the RUT.
- Keep invoices or equivalent documents.

Keep at least one of the documents that prove the export of services.

Maintain the certification of the service provider in which it is stated to the importer of the service that the service was provided to be used or consumed exclusively abroad (except for film and television production services and software development).

The documents that prove the export of the service must contain the following information:

- Value of the service or way of determining it.
- Country where the service is exported.
- Description of the service according to the international classification.
- Name of the purchaser of the service and his address or residence abroad.









Additional benefits of ZF Decree 278 of 2021

- The entry of used capital goods is allowed (without taking them into account to meet the investment requirement).
- Users acquire the quality of Foreign Trade Operators.
- Industrial users are allowed to establish commercial and administrative offices outside the Free Zone. (The goods will not be subject to the Free Zone incentives).
- Intangible assets are computed as investment: Intangible assets will be recognized as part of the investment commitments (up to 20% of the new investment).
- Extensions: The maximum extension for permanent and special permanent free zones is equalized in 30 years.
- Conversion: The possibility is created that the special permanent free zones for services can become permanent free zones, qualify users who provide services, such as science, technology, innovation, culture and knowledge, among others.
- Initial investment: Compliance with investment commitments may be accredited from the date of request for declaration up to 20%.

- Non-neighboring areas: Free zones are authorized to add non-adjacent areas to the originally declared space, provided that said areas are in the same municipality or in neighboring municipalities within the same customs jurisdiction.
- New activities for established FZs: The extension can be granted to other economic activities in addition to those originally declared.
- Electronic commerce: Users of goods and services may make use of electronic commerce, through the modality of postal traffic and urgent shipments. Sales made by free zone users over the internet will not be considered retail sales.
